
70% of America's food pantries – a key part of the solution to food waste – are based in or sponsored by a house of worship.

Faith Fights Food Waste was developed to educate clergy about the issue of food waste, and then give them the tools they need to share the issue with their congregation.

Information about food waste, faith-specific sample sermons, and more are available free of charge.

Faith Fights Food Waste materials were developed for Christian, Jewish, Muslim, Buddhist, Hindu and Unitarian-Universalists communities. Other faiths are welcome to adapt them for their use.

Clergy are urged to give sermons on the waste of food and further discussions about how reducing food waste can help congregations follow their faith traditions, save money at the grocery store and help improve the health of both themselves and the planet.
